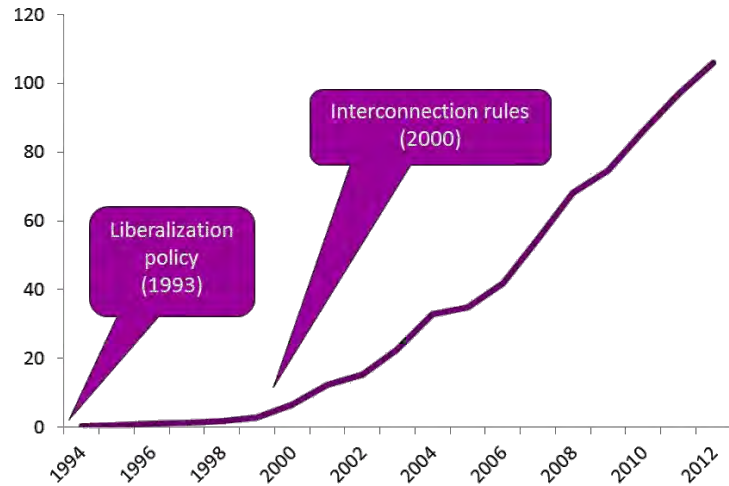


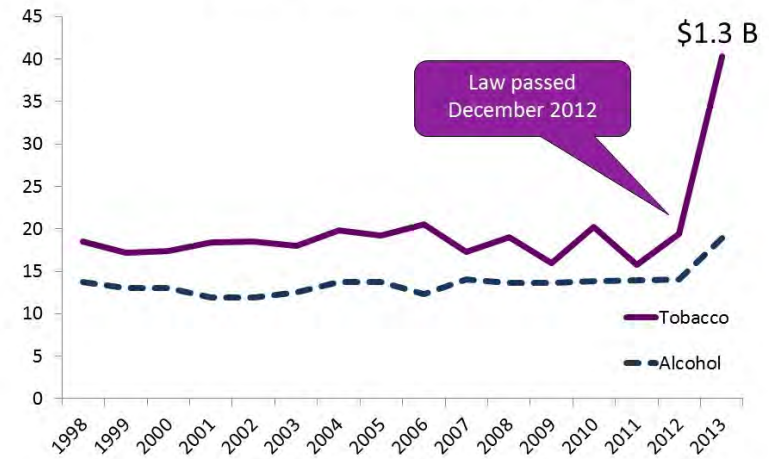

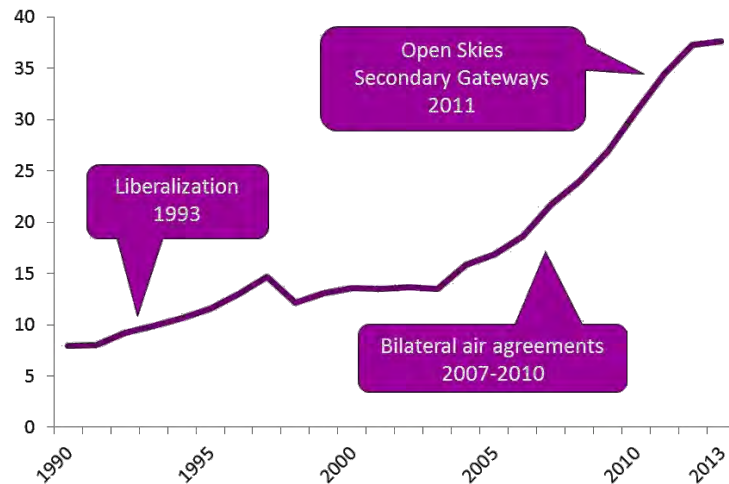

millions of users



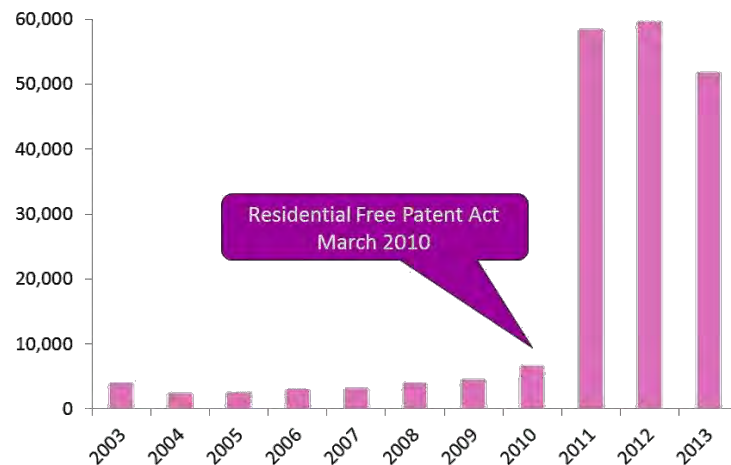
Excise Tax on Alcohol and Tobacco
